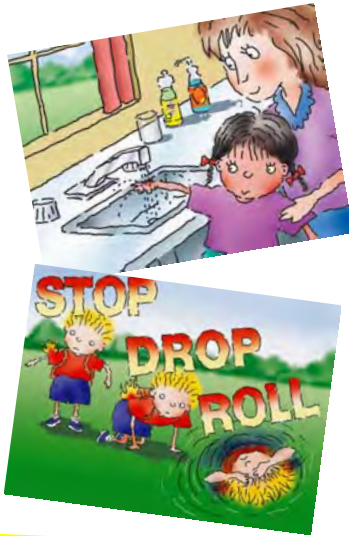
Fire Safe Kid Poster Contest

Contest Rules

- ✓ Poster entries must be original artwork. Markers, crayons, paint, pencil or pen are acceptable (please, no charcoal or pastel artwork). Posters must measure 8.5 x 11-inches; landscape (**horizontal**) format only. One safety theme per entry and only one entry per child. Artwork will be judged on creativity and content.
- ✓ On back of artwork (in pencil) please indicate the poster's theme (fire/burn prevention message), child's full name, age/grade, school, home address, phone number (daytime) and e-mail address.
- ✓ Contest is open to children 5-9 years living in San Diego and Imperial Counties.
- ✓ Artwork must be submitted **NO LATER THAN 5 p.m., Friday, May 17, 2013 (no exceptions)**. Posters must be mailed flat, and should not be folded, matted or mounted.
